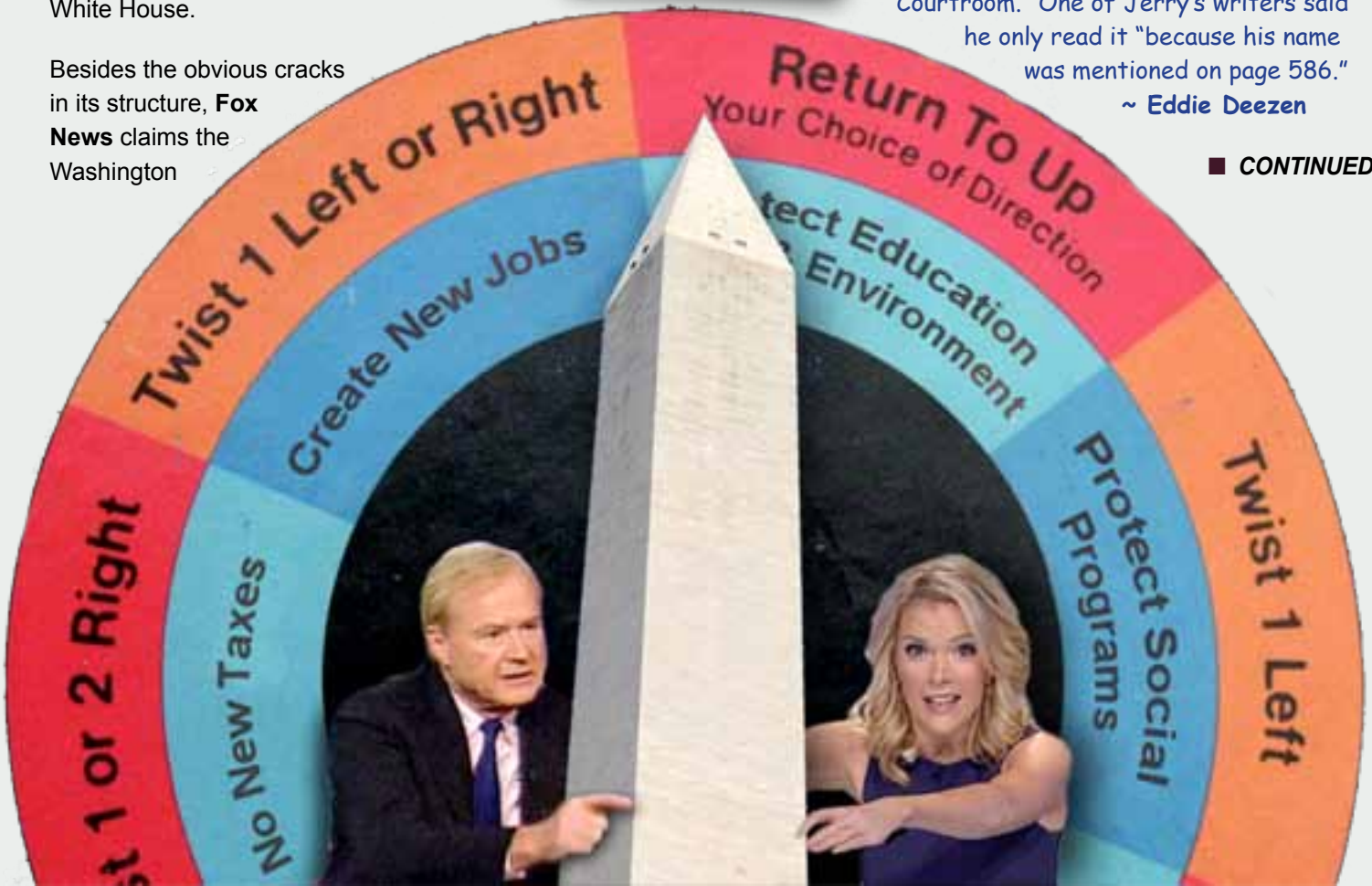
monument is now leaning to the right while **MSNBC** claims it's really leaning to the left.

THE BIG SPIN. Playing for effect is cracking up Washington coverage.

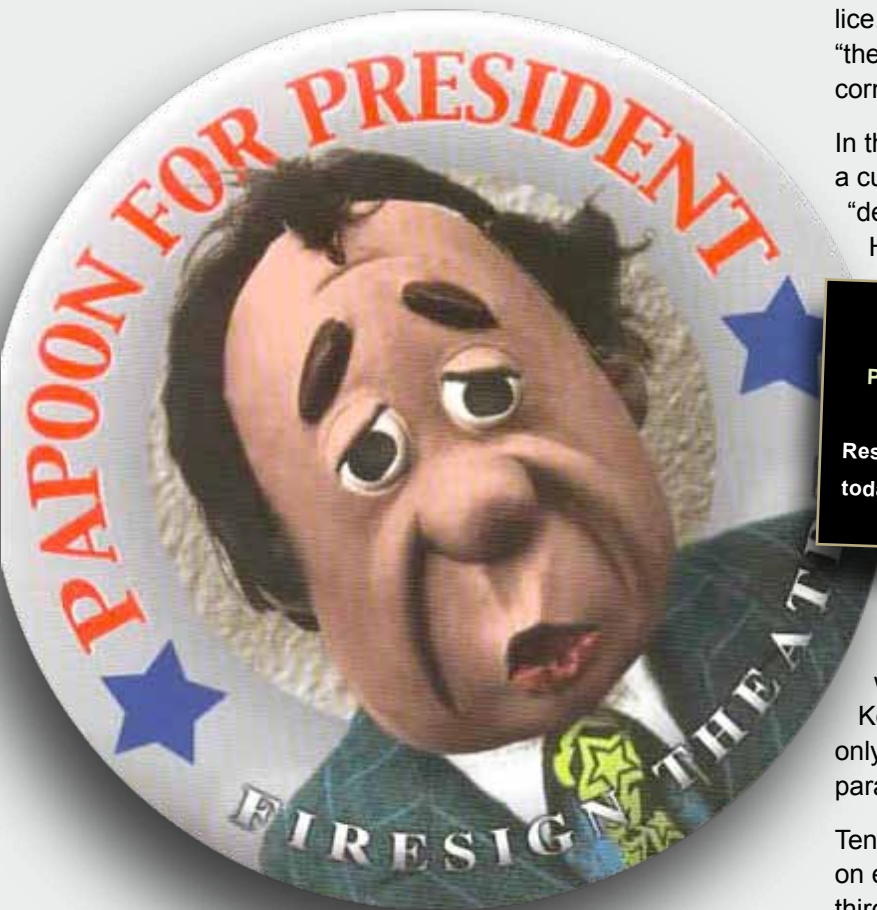

A woman goes into a store and buys a beautiful green parrot, but the only words the parrot knows how to say are: "Who is it?"

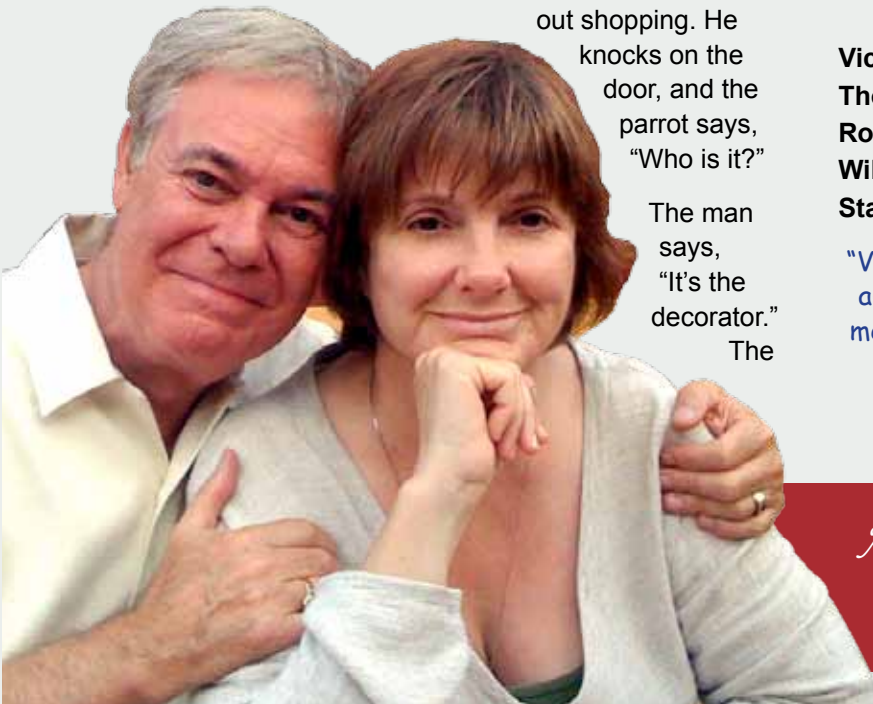
