THE HUMAN RACE

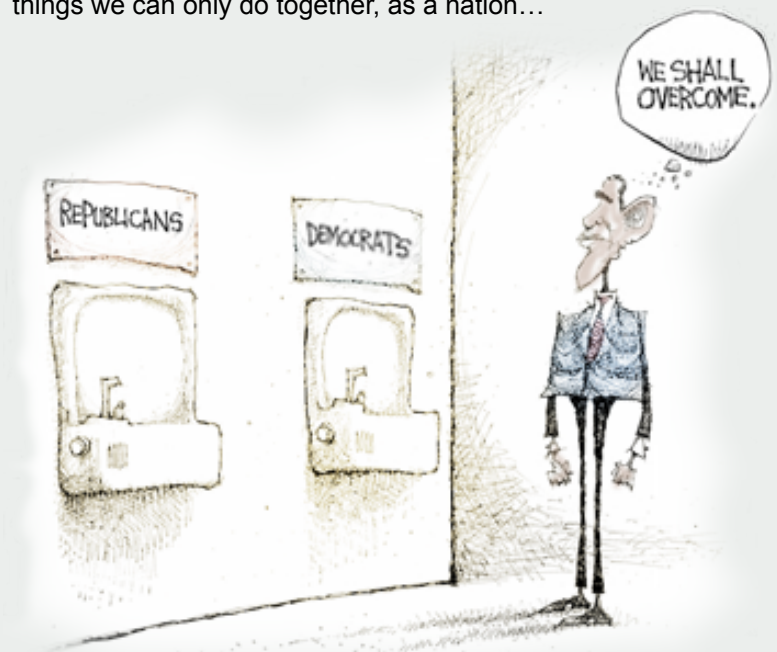

'AMERICATHON' FOREVER

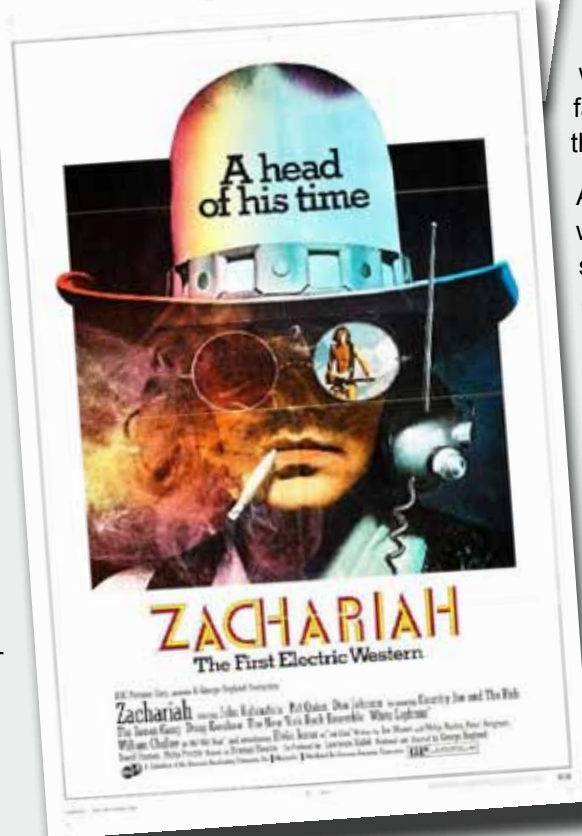
