NORMAN, WAS THAT YOU?

Our dear friend, **Norman Corwin**, the "poet of the airwaves," has died at his home in Los Angeles, at the ripe old age of 101, according to his wonderful caregiver,

Chris Borjas. Norman, who began his career in Boston as a newsman, experimented in "all forms of writing – whimsy, fantasy, historical drama, poetic narrative, propaganda, satire, science essay, burlesque, parody," wrote biographer

R. LeRoy Bannerman in *On a Note of Triumph: Norman Corwin and the Golden Years of Radio*.

THIS IS HEAVY

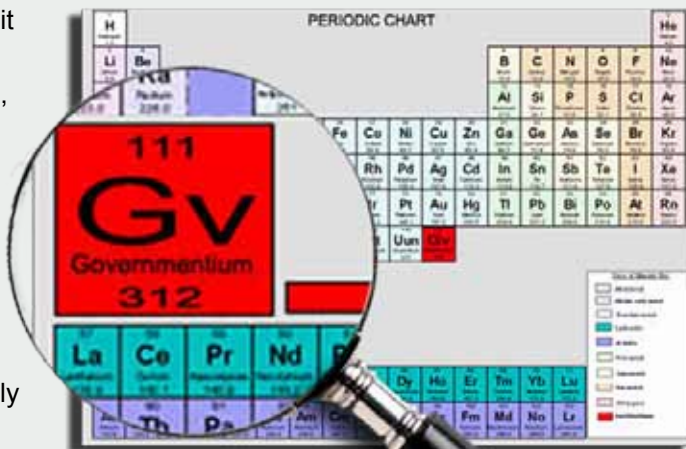
Oxford University researchers have discovered the heaviest element yet known to science. The new element, **Governmentium** (symbol=Gv), has one neutron, 25 assistant neutrons, 88 deputy neutrons and 198 assistant deputy neutrons, giving it an atomic mass of 312. These 312 particles are held together by forces called morons.

Since Governmentium has no electrons, it is inert. However, it can be detected, because it impedes every reaction with which it comes into contact.
