Toot-toot

HESTER, ILLINOIS, IS A SMALL TOWN WHOSE only claim to fame is its unique **Popeye Museum**, and there you will learn the true origins of this immortal character...



As the story goes, **Dolan Morgan** worked at the local tavern hauling kegs of beer, and whenever a fight broke out in the tavern, mighty Morgan would wade in and in minutes several men would be out cold on the floor! And so, Dolan became the inspiration for **Elzie Crisler Segar** (pictured at left with two

young fans) to create "Popeye the Sailor Man," who first appeared in the daily King Features comic strip Thimble Theatre on January 7, 1929.

And his girl pal, Olive Oyl, was also based on a local, a spindly shopkeeper who became a main character

a decade before Popeye's appearance.

The one-eyed, spinach-gobbling sailor quickly became the main focus of the strip during the '30s and became so popular that the strip's title became "Popeye," leading to appearances in countless animated cartoons for theaters and TV.

After Segar died in 1938, Thimble Theatre was continued by several writers and artists, most notably Segar's assistant **Bud Sagendorf**. In 1933, **Max Fleischer** adapted the Thimble Theatre characters into a series of "Popeye the Sailor" theatrical cartoon shorts for Paramount Pictures, which continued production through 1957. These productions also included Allied propaganda during the Second World War, and lead to comic books, television cartoons, video

games, hundreds of advertisements, peripheral products ranging from spinach to candy cigarettes, and **Robert** Altman's 1980 live-action

Schulz** said, "I think Popeye was a perfect comic strip, consistent in drawing and humor." In 2002, TV Guide ranked Popeye number 20 on its list of the "50 Greatest Cartoon Characters of All Time."

wever, when Popeye was created in 1929, *spinach* was slang for *cannabis*. It can be heard, for example, in that sentence in the number "The Spinach Song (I Didn't Like It The First Time)" by the jazz band Julia Lee and Her Boyfriends, who also had a hit with "Lotus Blossom (Sweet Marijuana)." They performed in jazz clubs in Kansas City where a cloud of weed smoke hung every evening,. They used spinach as a metaphor for marihuana and as American sailors were among the first to smoke cannabis



in the United States, why shouldn't the spinachaddicted Popeye ingest his greens through his pipe?

And of course, '30s anti-pot propaganda implied that cannabis made you immune to bullets and gave you supernatural powers, just like Popeye used to sing: "I'm strong to the finish 'cause I eat me spinach", and do you recall that his dog was

named Birdseed because in those days

birdsee contained hemp seed, so SING ALONG, MATEYS:


