




Laugh after death

Fishing for Corwin

BOUT THIS TIME OF YEAR IN 1941, AMERICA was increasingly divided over a life-and-death question: should we go to war? The country had not been so polarized since the 1860s. Families were divided. Old friends stopped speaking. Passionate arguments reached screaming and threatening levels. Isolationist "America Firsters" called interventionists "traitors." Sound familiar?


Norman Corwin was then creating a brand new radio play every Sunday for CBS, and the July 4th weekend was coming up. He wrote a piece he called "Between Americans" – an "informal conversation for informal listeners." The half-hour broadcast reminded listeners of how much we all had in common, what we all could agree on, and asked, "What does America mean to you?"

Then **Orson Welles** called Norman and asked permission to produce the script again, with himself in the leading role. By sheer chance (who knew?) Welles' broadcast was scheduled for the evening of December 7, 1941. It was the first program heard on CBS that day which was not a news report. Listeners wept and glowed with relief as America unified once again.

Flash forward to the 21st Century. Norman Corwin, now in his 90s, decided that this script needed a new production – but the original was too much set in its day, its language and references now outdated. He called a younger friend, **Richard Fish**, and asked him to help restructure the program for a modern audience. They worked on the revised script for several years and finally agreed on a new version in 2010. Corwin gave Fish the rights, but before a production could be arranged, he died at 101.

Without Corwin to help, it was 2021 before Fish could mount a production, thanks to the **National Audio Theatre Festivals**. The Covid pandemic made it necessary to record all the actors separately

Cast members, ecorded literally from Manhattan to Maui, ranged in age from 10 to 84; half female, half male; and either African, Hispanic, or Asian-Americans. I'm proud to say that I and the late **Melinda Peterson** are in **THE CAST**, and the principal voice is our dear friend **David Ossman**. The finished



production, with an original score, was acclaimed – and turned out to be more timely than ever. And now, CBS veteran **Tom Curley** has created a video component to complement the audio, and the result is spectacular.
